

Reclamation Research Technician summer job.

Location: Ekati Diamond Mine in the Northwest Territories with early morning flights from Calgary. Returning to Calgary late afternoons.

Job description

Helping set up and monitor reclamation research trials on diamond mine tailings and mining-related disturbances in a sub-arctic (tundra) environment.

Manual labour: shovelling, raking, transplanting seedlings, hand harvesting seed, some heavy lifting.

Vegetation monitoring, soil sampling. Ability to take clear, concise, accurate field notes.

Good plant identification skills are an asset.

Familiarity with ATV and small utility tractor use would also be assets.

If direct experience with the above is lacking applicants need a keen willingness to learn.

Must be able to stay happy working long hours outside in all sorts of weather (and bugs) on a small team.

General information

Accommodation is in a large industrial camp where managing dietary restrictions could be difficult.

There is no cell coverage but reasonably reliable internet is available in camp.

Schedule is approximately 2 weeks on site, 2 weeks off June – August. Work day is 6 AM to 6 PM every day.

Ekati is an operating mine so steel toes, hard hats, safety meetings etc. are mandatory.

Compensation is competitive with other full-time summer jobs.
